The book is written to be accessible to people of all ages and backgrounds.

Subsidizing copies of this book for schools, libraries and other public institutions is a key part of our program. In addition to the print version of the book, digital versions of all books and articles are available online for free to promote wildlife education.

Presentations and Events

Another key part of our program is direct interaction with students and the general public. We take students and the public face-to-face with wildlife in the field on guided hikes, and show our tiniest animals on the big screen during slide show presentations. Events are tailored to the audience, from toddlers to adults. Presentations include a variety of subjects: how our unique fauna arrived on the island, the different types of habitat and the animals that live in each, and the history of biological research on St. Martin.
